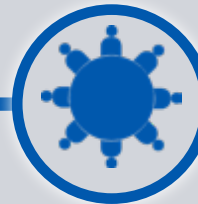
Glasgow-based social enterprises participated in the Pockets and Prospects programme – providing activities addressing loneliness and social isolation – with 350 people benefitting.
